St. Augustine's is a co-educational, special school for students, aged 7-18, with Mild General Learning Disabilities (MGLD). We also cater for students with Moderate General Learning Disabilities, if their independent living skills are at a high level.

If you are considering applying for a place in St. Augustine's School, you are encouraged to contact us as early

as possible, as places are limited for students from aged 12 upwards. Please read the following 3 items (under Policies):

- 3. Annual Admission Notice (shows places available for the following School year, the majority of which are at Primary Level).
- **School transport** is provided for students attending St. Augustine's School. If you are offered a place, we will make an application to National Council for Special Education (NCSE) on your behalf. Click **here** for Department Circular.
- Class sizes are currently 7-10 (but max. 12 students per class). There is 1 teacher and there are 1 or 2 special needs assistants (sna) per class, depending on needs in class and staffing resources to school. Snas in our school are not assigned to individual students, but work with all students in the class, supporting the teacher.
- St. Augustine's School caters for up to **160 students** (approximately 60% boys and 40% girls). This includes:
 - o 60 students with Mild GLD + Autism
 - o 40 students with Mild-Moderate GLD + Down Syn.
 - 60 students with Mild-Moderate GLD with or without diagnoses other than Autism and Down Syndrome.

- **Parents** are actively involved in St. Augustine's School Parents Association (SASPA), in The Special Olympics Swimming Club and in the Past-Pupils Clubs.
- Students **graduate** at age 18 with a combination of Junior Cycle Levels 2 and 3, QQI (formerly FETAC) Levels 2 and 3 and Junior Certificate Schools Programme (JCSP) qualifications.
- **Post St. Augustine's School**, students often accept placements in Festina Lente, STEP, WALK, Roslyn Park, Access Park House, SJoG Patrick Street, NLN, Autism Initiatives, Sunbeam House, Gheel, Turas, St. Michael's House, Central Remedial Clinic (Rehabilitative Training), etc.

- Places available are listed on our **Annual Admission Notice** and we generally accept applications from October of current year for enrolment in September of the following year. We recommend that you apply to other schools as well as St. Augustine's. Many schools are oversubscribed. We currently receive more applications than we have places each year. Waiting lists are held for the school year of application only and do not carry forward to the following year; parents need to
- date. Applications will also be returned if not submitted by REGISTERED POST through An Post.

We regret we cannot accept applications for students with a dual diagnosis of ASD+Moderate GLD, students with a diagnosis of Borderline (IQ >70) or Psychological Reports dated 2 years past application

- RECOMMEND A SPECIAL SCHOOL PLACEMENT.
- MAKE REFERENCE TO THE NEED FOR AN SNA AND/OR BUS ESCORT IF DEEMED NECESSARY.
- REFERENCE ANY ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY RECOMMENDED.
- REFERENCE ANY OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY SUPPORTS E.G. CHAIR.
- **REFERENCE ANY RELEVANT HEARING, VISUAL/ SPEECH &** LANGUAGE INTERVENTIONS.
